MSU COLLEGE OF NURSING STUDENT PERFORMANCE POLICY

Professional Development Guidelines

Preparation for the professional practice of nursing requires more than the acquisition and application of knowledge. Therefore, in addition to the academic criteria listed in the progression in the major guidelines, the student roust demonstrate:

- 1) appropriate interpersonal relations and communication with clients, peers, faculty and other health care personnel;
- responsible fulfillment of class and practicum obligations, including provision of safe nursing care in the practicum setting; and
- 3) honesty and integrity in all academic and professional matters.

These expectations are reflected in the Undergraduate Professional Development Objectives and Graduate (MSN) Clinical Performance Criteria for each clinical nursing course. Failure to meet each Professional Development Objective will result in the student earning a grade of 0.0 for the course.

Faculty reserve the right to dismiss a student from clinical areas if the student is too ill, unprepared, or deemed to be a risk to patient safety. Dismissal from clinical for any reason, excluding student illness, is deemed unexcused, thus carrying the requisite grade consequence as described in the course syllabus.

Nurse Practice Act/Michigan Criminal Code

Students enrolled in the College of Nursing must conduct themselves so as to conform with the with the Nurse Practice Act of the State of Michigan. Students must also demonstrate maturity of judgment. In assessing the quality of a student's academic and clinical performance, the faculty take: account of the student's maturity of judgment, as well as the professional development guidelines noted above. The College of Nursing may refuse enrollment, discontinue enrollment, or refuse re-enrollment of any student who violates the Nurse Practice Act, or who, in the professional judgment of the faculty, exhibits a serious deficiency with respect to her or his maturity of judgment or conformity with the professional development guidelines.

Academic/Professional Development Warning Status

The Academic/Professional Development Warning Status serves as an intermediate step prior to dismissal from the major. The purpose of this status is to notify a student of the College's concern with his or her record of academic/professional performance. This status is designed as an intervention step to decrease the likelihood of ultimate dismissal from the major. Students will be sent a letter notifying them of their placement on academic warning status. The following events warnant placement on Academic/Professional Development Warning Status:

Under graduate Guidelines

- 1) receipt of a mid-semester warning notice in more than one course in any given semester,
- 2) a second withdrawal from a required course,
- 3) receipt of more than two grades of incomplete (I) during enrollment in the major,
- earning a GPA of less than a 2.0 on any required course in the Nursing major, including any student who must re-enroll in (repeat) a course. A student is allowed to repeat a course in the nursing major only once,
- 5) receipt of a GPA of less than 2.0 in any semester, or
- placement on academic probation according to University policy because of a cumulative GPA of less than 2.0.

Graduate (MSN) Guidelines

- 1) receipt of a mid-semester warning notice in more than one course in any given semester,
- 2) a second withdrawal from a required course,
- earning a GPA of less than 3.0 on any required course in the Nursing major including any student who must re-enroll in (repeat) a course. A students is allowed to repeat a course in the nursing major only once, or
- 4) receipt of a GPA of less than 3.0 in any semester.

Dismissal from the College of Nursing

Dismissal from the College of Nursing will occur in the following cases:

- 1) Undergraduate students who earn TWO final grades below 2.0 in theory and/or clinical nursing courses will be dismissed from the Nursing major.
- 2) Graduate (MSN) students who earn TWO final grades below 3.0 in any required course will be ineligible for degree candidacy and thus dismissed from the program.
- 3) Any student who engages in any act which is a serious violation of the Criminal Code of Michigan or which seriously compromises the welfare or integrity of another person.
- Any student who experiences repeated physical, behavioral, or psychological difficulty which interferes with his or her ability to meet academic and/or professional objectives for an extended period of time.

Students deemed ineligible to continue in the nursing major due to academic or professional distribution distribution of the Office of the Dean. Undergraduate students will be provided a copy of the Office of Student Affairs Education/Career Options Packets which includes information on health related undergraduate majors and curricula at MSU. Students will also be referred to the Director of the Office of Student Affairs for major/career advising and counseling referral as appropriate. Graduate (MSN) students will be referred to their program advisor (major professor) for clarification of professional options.
