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Admission as a Junior in Business Administration

Enrollment in the Broad College of Business is limited, and admission to the College is competitive. Criteria for admission are listed below.

1. Completion of 56 credits.
2. Completion of the following core courses:
 - a. ~~Mathematics 103 or 124.~~
 - b. Statistics and Probability 315.*
 - c. ~~b.~~ Economics 201 ~~or 202.~~ and*
 - d. ~~c.~~ Accounting 201 and 202.*
 - e. ~~d.~~ Accounting 202 or Computer Science and Engineering 101 ~~or second Economics from 2. b.~~*
3. A student must declare a business major preference by April 15 for Fall semester admission or November 15 for Spring semester admission.
4. Admission decisions are based primarily on cumulative University grade-point average and grades in every completed core course listed above. Academic and non-academic factors and experiences will also be considered. Students seeking admission should contact the Eli Broad College Undergraduate Academic Services Center.
